Introduction

The Umpqua Valley Arts Association is proud to present our 42nd Annual Summer Arts Festival, the largest arts festival in Douglas, Coos and Curry Counties. This eagerly anticipated celebration of the arts is free to the public (with a suggested donation of \$4 at the gate) and is strongly promoted through newspaper coverage, television coverage and public interest. The Arts Center is in the heart of Roseburg, is open to the public, houses 5 galleries, gift shop, working artist studio and a clay studio and classroom which rests in the center of historic Fir Grove Park. The Arts Festival Marketplace features 100+ fine artists and craftspeople from around the Northwest. Artists will offer work in a wide variety of juried mediums including painting, ceramics, glass, jewelry, wood, photography and fiber. In addition to the Marketplace, free performances by regional acts will be presented on the Family and Main Stages. To help celebrate this year's event UVAA will be hosting many activities including a 5k run and competition through the park on Saturday morning. This three day festival will host more than 11,000 people over the course of the weekend. We are dedicated to providing you, the exhibiting artist and food vendor, the support needed to experience an enjoyable and profitable weekend.

Festival Dates & Hours

The dates of the Festival are Friday, June 25, from noon until 8pm, Saturday, June 26, from 10am to 8pm and Sunday, June 27 from 10am to 4pm. The Beer & Wine Garden, Food Court and entertainment on the Main Stage will go until 9:00pm on Friday and Saturday nights in order to serve you after you close at 8pm.

Non-Profit booths are required to remain open and available for arts festival patrons until the 8pm closing time; **no exceptions.**

No animals, bicycles or skateboards on Festival grounds; **no exceptions.**

No overnight camping is allowed in Fir Grove Park; **no exceptions.**

Smoking area in designated parking area; **no exceptions.**

No electricity to sites; no generators allowed.

Booth Information

Non-Profit booth spaces will be assigned in the west end area in front of the Art Center building by the Festival Committee in a way to appeal to visitors and best accent each Non-Profit Vendor. Non-Profit space is limited and will be assigned on a first come, first served basis once application is received with payment. Each booth space measures approximately 10 feet deep by 11 feet wide. Booth structure dimensions should measure no larger than 10 feet by 10 feet (10' x 10') to provide adequate clearance between booths. Non-profit booths are \$100 per 10x10.

Exhibitors are responsible for providing their own booth structures with canopies, racks, tables, display units or other fixtures suitable for outdoor use; all of the above must be kept inside the booth space so as not to crowd, encroach or cover the surrounding booths; **no exceptions.** If more booth space is needed we recommend that you apply for two. Exhibitors are encouraged to be prepared for any inclement weather with appropriate rain covers, tie-downs and weights. Direct sun can be a factor as well, since most booths are in direct sun or only partial shade.

Limited organization signage is allowed and is subject to assessment by the festival committee. If booth is sponsored by an outside party, sponsorship signage is limited to 2' x 2' and must be confined to inside the booth area.

Non-Profit booths are informational booths, but are allowed to make raffles available to the public and are encouraged to provide artful crafts to promote their cause. **Sales of goods are strictly prohibited.** The Festival Committee reserves the right to require the booth occupant to either modify or remove any material deemed commercial and not appropriate to the booth. Failure to comply may result in the booth being closed down without any refund.
