



Class Descriptions for Camps for Children in 1st through 4th Grade



Location: Studio East Time: 9:00am-12:00noon. Teacher: JoEllen Waldvogel

Description: Make your own children's book illustrations using watercolor, chalk, and tissue paper! We'll explore the wacky illustrations of artists like Eric Carle, and learn about line, shape, and texture in books!

July 14-17: Anything Goes

Location: Outdoors (UVA East end of the building)

Time: 9:00am-12:00noon. Teacher: Victoria Carnate

Description: From papier mache to funky junky, from wacky wire & wood to steampunk, classes will include historical and contemporary art. Artists such as Calder, Cornell, Powers, will be a source of inspiration.

July 21-24: Wearable Art!

Location: Studio East Time: 9:00am-12:00noon. Teacher: Megan Dee

Description: Why put art on the wall when we could WEAR IT!? Young artists will learn a special paper mache technique to create a cuff bracelet to decorate. Model magic clay will be used to create Native American Story Necklaces. Next, we will take a "selfie", print it out and draw wearable art according to a personal chosen theme on our head. Last, on of Mrs. Dee's "special-Dee's" is making crazy, silly paper vests!

July 28-31: Art and Food

Location: Studio East Time: 9:00am-12:00noon. Teacher: Megan Dee

Description: This week we are going to cook up some fantastic art that looks like your favorite food! Students will take inspiration from artists like Wayne Thiebaud and Claes Oldenburg when creating their masterpieces. Our first course will be to create a mixed media Bob's Burger. We will then draw a bowl of fruit for a snack. We will draw loli-pops and then create those in real life and use watercolor to make them look bright and tasty. Paper mache will be used to create a realistic 3D ice cream cone for a special dessert treat.

August 4-7: Fantasy Island

Location: Studio East. Time: 9:00am-12:00noon. Teacher: Larry Stokes

Description: Explore the sea and the creatures that live in it with this class inspired by the tropics! Dive deep and enjoy the sun with art projects that will transport you to a fantasy island! Make an underwater tunnel book, clay animals of all shapes and sizes, and a hand-woven basket!

August 11-14: The Mighty Jungle

Description: Stimulate your imagination as we explore the mighty jungle! We'll make jungle animal batiks, animal silhouettes, and animal sock puppets inspired by artist like Henri Rousseau!

August 18-21: Edible Art

Description: Who says kids shouldn't play with their food? During this camp, we'll explore ways to turn all kinds of food--both sweet and savory--into incredible works of art. Plus, design your own chef's apron and create other fun kitchen crafts throughout the week.

Class Descriptions for Camps for Children in 4th through 8th Grade

July 7-10: Outdoor Exploration

Location: Studio East Time: 1:00pm-4:00pm. Teacher: Morgan Krepky

Description: Explore the world around you! Join us for active outdoor projects and learn about different plant and animal species through art. This class will have projects inspired by Faith Ringgold and Heeyoung Kim. We will create mixed media collages and botanical drawings, and we will learn the art of bookmaking!

July 14-17: Comics and Storytelling

Location: Studio East Time: 1:00pm-4:00pm. Teacher: Morgan Krepky

Description: Whoosh! Bang! Boom! Join us for comic making! Learn the traditional inking techniques of comics through the ages while utilizing a series of different bookbinding techniques to explore comic book form. Make a story all your own!

July 21-24: From the Surreal to the Street: Sculpture and Painting

Location: Studio East Time: 1:00pm-4:00pm. Teacher: Kristyn Karnes

Description: Open your mind to the surreal and strange. Come make something strange, explore your mind, and discover a passion for the fantastic! This week we will learn about surrealism and street art, while creating paintings in watercolor, oil pastel, and acrylic paint, and making sculptures using modelling clay.

July 28-31: Piecing it Together

Location: Studio East Time: 1:00pm-4:00pm. Teacher: Cheryl Stokes

Description: Ever wanted to make your own paper for writing, scrapbooking, and collage? This week we'll master some watercolor techniques, and work with yarn and other materials to make colorful ornaments like Ojos de Dios. But most importantly we'll make our own paper, and then use it as the building blocks for some incredible collages that explore the natural world and your own imagination.

August 4-7: Urban Farmers

Location: Studio East Time: 1:00pm-4:00pm. Teacher: Morgan Krepky

Description: This class covers a playful exploration of growing food, and discovering where it comes from, as well as learning to look at nature as something to create with. Students will enjoy creating art in the garden, learning about how to compost, plant, and harvest! We will make leaf and flower masks, bird feeders, hanging planters for succulents, flowerpots, and much more.

August 11-14: Paint a Masterpiece

Location: Studio East Time: 1:00pm-4:00pm. Teacher: Kristyn Karnes

Description: This week we'll get in the studio and learn about all kinds of painting techniques, from oil pastel to mixed-media to watercolor! We'll learn about famous painters and you'll get a chance to make the medium your own and create a variety of masterpiece works! Get something to hang on your walls—you'll take home your own oil paintings, watercolors, and dynamic mixed media creations! Paint portraits, landscapes, and more!

August 18-21: Creative Calligraphy

Location: Studio East Time: 1:00pm-4:00pm. Teacher: Taylor Bennett

Description: Make your handwriting come alive! We'll learn fun and easy techniques to help you jazz up any thank-you card or letter you write by turning basic handwriting into artistic calligraphy. Plus, we'll design our own stationary, create beautiful watercolor backgrounds to write on, and discover the lost art of letter writing.

Special Class: Photo Fun

July 28-31, 9am-noon Location: Gallery 2 Teacher: Taylor Bennett

For young artists ages 10 and up.

Description: Learn how to take top-notch pictures...on your smartphone! Participate in daily photo scavenger hunts, learn to edit your photos, and use your favorite shots to create a one-of-a-kind work of art to take home at the end of the week. (Students must have a phone with camera capabilities to participate.)

August 18-21, 1pm-4pm Location: Gallery 2 Teacher: Stella Moon

For young artists ages 9 and up.

Description: In this class, students will start by learning the basic techniques of paper folding and then quickly move onto some more advanced projects, learning about sculpture and geometry. Students will be learning how to make tessellations, modular origami, and kinetic sculptures and learn the concepts of abstract art and composition-making
